**Sunday, July 15<sup>th</sup> 10am *Early years of the Universalist Society of Strafford 1798 -1834*** led by John Freitag. The founding of the Universalist Society of Strafford was an important event not only for the people of Strafford but also for Universalism. The Universalist Society of Strafford is the 2nd oldest Universalist Church in Vermont and 4th oldest in the nation. In Strafford, the church played a role in helping to heal bitter divisions created during the Revolutionary War. In 1802, early Universalist Churches gathered in a General Convention at the Strafford Town House to work out their Articles of Faith. The talk on the early history will be followed by a viewing of the church and later for those interested, the 1799 Strafford Town House.

### *Message from our Minister*

I was so glad to be sitting with people from our congregation along with about 150 others attending a Community Forum in the Thetford Congregational Church, focused on the separation of children from their families crossing the Southern border. I have felt angry, helpless, and hopeless over the past few weeks as this terrible situation has unfolded, and knew I was not alone in grappling with these feelings. To be sitting in a sanctuary with so many others who came together to learn and see what we might do, how we might use our energy and our voices in facing this crisis was inspiring. Here are the words of our U.S. Senator Patrick Leahy in a press release - "Today the American people, through their forceful and justified outrage, proved that people, joining together, can drive positive change...". In the face of a crisis, it can feel like each of us as individuals have little power to affect change but when we come together, we're reminded that we are not alone. There are many, many of us, more than we can imagine that are deeply committed to the values of justice and compassion, and we can find courage in joining together.

Faith communities around the country are coming together to re-commit and demonstrate their values around this crisis at our borders. Organizations and individuals are being called to help in whatever ways they can to find parents and re-unite them with their children. It is a daunting process but the gathering in the Thetford Church sanctuary highlighted the reality that so many of us needed to go, to listen and learn, to be surrounded by others, united by our values and our compassion. But I was also reassured once again that the emotions I was experiencing were shared by others. I actually felt moments of peace, that when a national or local crisis overtakes us, we are called to act, to speak but we also to work at maintaining our center and stay grounded in our faith.

Summertime can feel like a season for letting go, relaxing, enjoying an iced coffee on a porch, and taking the time to watch birds fly by. It is a beautiful and abundant time when everything is so green and growing, and it can offer peaceful moments. Dr. M. Scott Peck spent time on the Isle of Skye and experienced a deep sense of peace that allowed him to explore his own relationship with fighting for peace and peacemaking. He writes: *“Peace is not just one thing with a single cause. Peace is many things; among them, a spirit, a gift, a condition, a process, a decision, a victory of love over evil, an ongoing task and the predictable result of a great deal of highly disciplined hard work.”* [p. 247, *In Search of Stones - A Pilgrimage of Faith, Reason and Discovery.*] I was struck by his all-encompassing vision for peace, and the reality that finding those moments of peace in our lives every day, experiencing the beauty of this season, can relax our fears and build our courage.
