There are plenty of days and moments when we can feel like we are having to face a crisis or decision alone; when we believe that it is up to us as individuals to find the solution or next step forward. At times, we might feel like we don't want to burden others with our struggles, or that they have enough to deal with already. But we need to reach out, to ask for support, to recognize that it is through connecting with another person, that we can become stronger and more resilient. It is in taking that courageous step of sharing our own story and opening the doorway to conversation, that the idea of giving up can fade away and be replaced with hope. There is a solution; there is a step I can take; there are others who have faced a similar challenge and here is how they handled it. Being part of a small community has its benefits and challenges. We are known to each other perhaps even when we might want to just disappear and be one of a large crowd. Our small circle is intimate and caring. We are involved in each others lives. We need to be. And it is up to us to care for our building, make decisions, and find creative solutions, together. Never giving up means recognizing that caring and community are stronger forces then fear and isolation. What are we asked to do in the face of seemingly insurmountable problems we are facing as individuals and as a society? Search and claim what reassures us, gives us hope and brings us alive!

We are invited to become more deeply involved, to move towards each other, to find out who is sitting beside us and what they're afraid of, what they love? I receive many e-mail messages each day from a host of organizations supporting social change, from gun control to early childhood education to immigrant justice. I yearn to do more, and would love to be able to attend rallies and be part of that larger movement, but then I remind myself that yes, I am serving a small community that has a vision to nurture, and good work to do together. There are many other small UU congregations that most likely have similar fears and hopes. Can we find ways to come together and support each other? Again, it will take courage even to reach across the aisle toward people we don't know and envision work we might accomplish and lives we might change. Every one of us has faced a time when we felt alone. We have had to develop our resilience in order to recover, make changes, reclaim our own life and feel a part of something larger. Eric Grietens offers: "We all need resilience to live a fulfilling life. With resilience, you'll be more prepared to take on challenges, to develop your talents, skills, and abilities so that you can live with more purpose and more joy." These qualities are needed for us as individuals and as a congregation. Let us feel the care and possibility within our circle and come together to nurture and live into our vision for what and who our community can be.
